Problems Receiving Invoices?

Due to our invoices being sent password protected, this means that the email provider is unable to scan the email & attachments for viruses, which may mean that the invoice is automatically rejected. To avoid this happening, if you add *@rainbownursery.info as a trusted sender in your settings, it will bypass the requirement to scan for viruses.



The children then took full advantage of the wet weather we have had this month, taking the boats outside onto the playground. They found some big puddles and investigated if their boats could float on the water!






Coming up in December...
